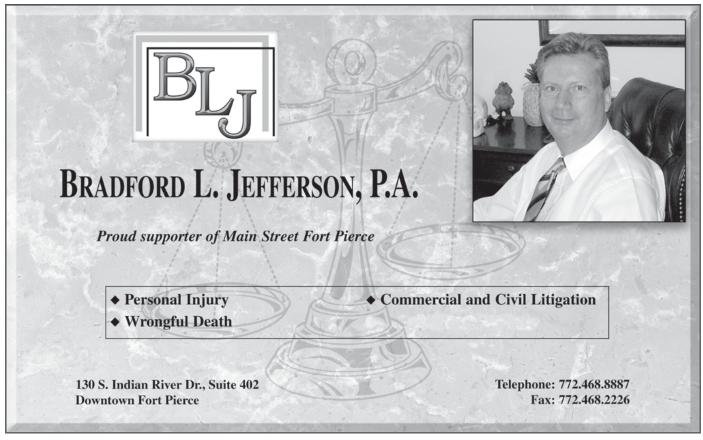

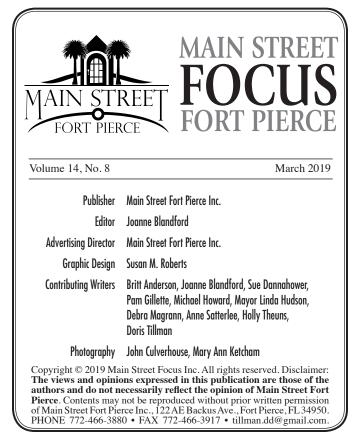

Join Officials from Cork, Ireland & Fort Pierce for the St. Patrick's Day GAA Exhibition Games

The City of Fort Pierce will welcome officials from the other side of the pond at a special Irish *St. Patrick's Day GAA Exhibition* to be held at **Lawnwood Stadium**, located at 1302 Virginia Avenue, at 11 a.m. on Sunday, March 10th.

The GAA is the *Gaelic Athletic Association* which was founded in 1884 to promote and organize Irish sports of "hurling" and "Gaelic football." Over the years, both of these sports have developed internationally and are played by males and females, both young and old.

These games will be on display during this event as well as Irish dancers, music and a parade of activities preceding the games. There will also be a "Key to the City" ceremony which will take place between the City of Fort Pierce and the City of Cork, Ireland. In attendance to accept the key, will be Lord Mayor of Cork, Mick Finn, with Fort Pierce Mayor, Linda Hudson presenting it.

The games will be played as an inaugural tournament for the Fort Pierce trophies which will be presented after the event. All are welcome to attend this special celebration of Irish heritage and culture.

Second Annual Fort Pierce Blessing of the Fleet Scheduled for March 9th

The *Blessing of the Fleet* is a time-honored tradition where vessels are blessed to mark the beginning of a safe boating season. The procession will begin at the Turning Basin and parade east toward the Fort Pierce Inlet. Each boat will be blessed as it passes the Coast Guard vessel.

Everyone is invited to a free community barbecue following the parade with marine safety booths, demonstrations by the U.S. Coast Guard and live music starting at 12:00 p.m. at South Causeway Park (414 Seaway Drive, Fort Pierce). The small craft blessing (kayaks, jet skis, etc.) will take place from the shore of South Causeway Park at 1:00 p.m.

To the Wearing of the Green — St. Patrick's Day Around the World and in Fort Pierce

rick's Day and probably have downed a pint o' two of the green beer, but what do we really know about Saint Patrick? He was born in Scotland in 387 and died in Ireland in 493 (though some sources put his death as 460 or 463). He was born to a Roman family and while his father was a priest, he claimed no religious inclination at an early age. At 16, he was captured by the Irish and sold into slavery where he tended sheep and it was during this time that he



turned to Christianity according to his writings in "Confessio" (one of two of his only writings). He also became familiar with the details and language of Druidism. After 6 years, he fled his captivity to Britain, by ship. In the ensuing years, he spent time in Europe (countries as we know them had yet to be formed) and with religious leaders, was ordained in the priesthood and was given the mission of "gathering the Irish into the fold" by Pope St. Celestine.

By all accounts, he returned to Ireland in 433 to begin his mission. It is shortly thereafter that he performed his miracles. What follows is a short version of those miracles, greatly oversimplified by me.

- 1) A confrontation occurred between St. Patrick and his "forces" and the "king/chieftain" of a local druid clan, in which the king/chieftain's body was turned to stone until he converted to Christianity.
- 2) In the second miracle, a fire was set and the king/chieftain (a different one) could not put it out until St. Patrick to

the astonishment of all — rode through the flames and they were no longer. He was recognized for his mercy and piety. There is some question as to the Saint's financial dealings and about wealthy woman but we must consider the times in which he lived, pre-middle ages. There is no doubt that he established the Roman Catholic Church in Ireland and drove out or converted the older druid segments. One of his most enduring teachings was the use of the shamrock to illustrate the trinity: it's

three leaves on a stem representing God the Father, Jesus his Son, and the Holy Spirit. However, most of what we know of St. Patrick has come down to us by later scholars and clerics in the 16th and 17th centuries.

St. Patrick's Day is observed on March 17th, the supposed date of his death. In Ireland, it is a day both of solemnity and a holy day of obligation as well as a celebration of Ireland itself. It is celebrated in many other countries as well as in the United States where there are 34.7 million U.S. residents with Irish ancestry; more than seven times he population of Ireland itself.

The first St. Patrick's Day parade in the U.S. was in 1762 when Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched in New York City. Parades, shamrocks, Irish soda bread, corned beef and cabbage have also become associated with the St. Patrick's Day celebration. By all references, green beer was first poured in the Bronx in 1914 but the "downing of the Shamrock" (beer in which a shamrock has been placed), has no date to which it can attached. The coloring of lakes and streams and

But your palate will be even happier to know that there's also sausage, pancakes, biscuits — with the Summerlin Family secret recipe for sausage gravy — fresh-squeezed **Nelson Family Farms** orange juice, Plant City strawberries, and, naturally, mimosas and Bloody Marys.

Each year, the highlight of the event takes place at 12:30 p.m. with the raffle drawing for an original painting. This year, the painting is beautiful 30" x 24" scene, St. Lucie River (1968), oil on canvas, valued at \$25,000. This striking vertical scene captures the fragile grandeur of our local ecosystem and is a magnificent reminder of the importance of our natural environment. Only 2,500 tickets will be available, so odds are exceptionally good to win if you participate. You need not be present to win, but you do need to buy a ticket, and the more you buy, the better your chances.

While enjoying the *Backus Brunch* or waiting for the raffle, you can also delight in the final day of the special exhibition, *Artists of Color: Place, Race, and Vision* of the *Florida Highwaymen*. The exhibition will be on view until 4:00 p.m., March 3, 2019.

other objects can be attributed to the inventiveness of other Irish-Americans.

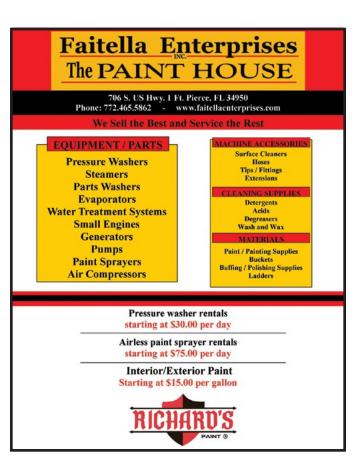

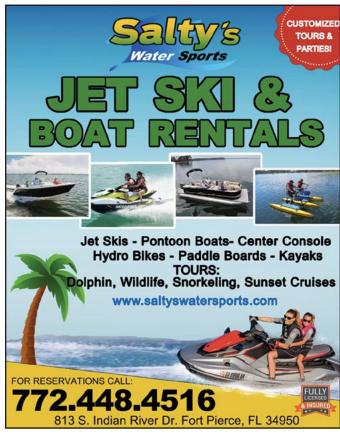












Arbor Day Foundation Names Fort Pierce Tree City USA

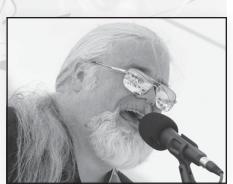
so grab a friend and have an afternoon to remember with all your favorite songs from the Great American Songbook.

Small Business Solutions: Mentoring: the Missing Link to Small Business Growth and Survival

As a former small business owner and entrepreneur, I know first-hand the support, resources and access to networks and financing that entrepreneurs need. While there are many businesses that experience success, the fact remains that only half of all small businesses survive more

than five years (source: SBA Office of Advocacy); and about 10–12 percent of all employee-based firms close each year. There is growing evidence, however, that connecting a business with a mentor can change this statistic.

Having a mentor can change the playing field for a small business. Research has shown us that small businesses that receive mentoring early in the development of the business achieve higher revenues and increased business growth. A survey by the UPS Store found that 70 percent of small businesses that received mentoring survived more than five years — double the survival rate of non-mentored businesses. The same survey found that 88 percent of business owners with a mentor said that having one was invaluable.

When Lorena Cantarovici first set her sights on entrepreneurship, she attended a workshop run by a SBA Denver Small Business Development Center that helped her develop her first business plan. Lorena's love for hand-crafted empanadas turned into a thriving small business. Early on, she got counseling from the SBDC on accounting, marketing, legal issues and

risk management. As demand soared, her business grew and she was able to move from a converted kitchen in her garage to a storefront.

Because starting a business can be overwhelming, a mentor can help to navigate the complex challenges that often come with being a business owner. There are many factors involved in business startup, from applying for licensing to securing financing. And those factors can have an impact on turning one's passion into a profitable business. Getting guidance from someone who has been there themselves as an entrepreneur or business owner can be an added asset. In addition, there are resources available to provide business owners with the knowledge and guidance that are key to business growth, development and survival.

Having a business mentor can yield many benefits and provide the expertise that you might not have. A mentor can help you avoid common pitfalls through their real-life experiences. And a mentor can help establish you as a lifelong learner.

The SBA's experienced volunteer mentors can provide meaningful business advice, some at no cost. Lorena is a great example of entrepreneurship, and a symbol of the many ways the SBA supports entrepreneurs as they start and grow. She was even honored as the SBA's Colorado Small Business Person of the Year in 2017.

There are several SBA resources in the community committed to making your small business a success.





Working with a mentor or counselor from SCORE, a Small Business Development Center, Women's Business Center or a Veterans Business Outreach Center can help with all aspects of starting, growing or expanding your business.

SBA's sources of Mentoring and Counseling:

Women's Business Centers (WBCs) are part of a nationwide network that provides business training, counseling and other resources to help women start and grow successful businesses. Tied closely to the SBA, WBCs are also able to advise women about business financing such as SBA loan programs. If you are interested in selling to the U.S. government, WBCs can also provide guidance and training resources to help you get started and navigate the process.

Small Business Development Centers (SBDCs) help entrepreneurs realize their dream of business ownership, and SBDC counselors can help businesses remain competitive in an ever-changing global economy. Business owners can access free one-on-one counseling and low-cost training. Some of the counseling and training topics

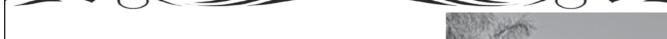
available include marketing, regulatory compliance, technology development and international trade.

SCORE is the nation's largest network of volunteer business mentors. These business executives share real-world knowledge at no cost and fit your busy schedule. SCORE mentors are available as often as you need in person, via email or over video chat.

Veterans Business Outreach Centers provide entrepreneurial development services such as business training, counseling and resource partner referrals to transitioning service members, veterans, National Guard & Reserve members and military spouses interested in starting or growing a small business.

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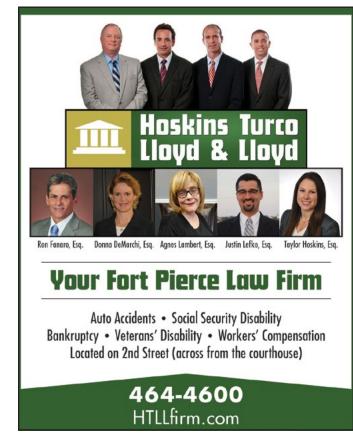

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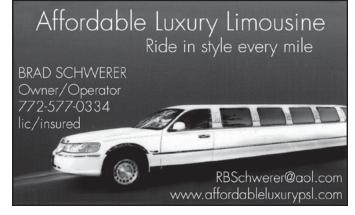
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Microwave Cooking Tips

Having a hard time with peeling fruits like tomatoes and peaches? Just place these fruits in the microwave on high

March Fishing Report: The Treasure Coast

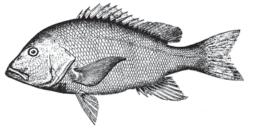

There's more than one reason why we are called the Treasure Coast! Inshore, the bite is good for snook, trout, and redfish along the flats, docks, and bridges from high slack tide to the outgoing tide. For many anglers, snook fishing is the main focus and bait fishing with pilchards is a good bet to catch one of these prized linesiders. When targeting snook, make sure you have your drag set tight as these fighters are good at breaking off around pilings, docks and other structure. As the water continues to warm up, the snook action will increase. Fishing the Indian River can also produce black drum, flounder, and tripletail. Sheepshead are still around the inshore reefs and live shrimp will definitely give some steady action.

Offshore bottom fishing is great for snapper, usually chewing on the reef in about 60–90 foot. Bottom fishing with cut-bait or live can see a variety of big snapper in the boat like mangroves, lanes, and mutton. While anchored, it's a great idea to put a flat line out behind the boat for a chance to hook king-fish, cobia, or even a sail.

For fishing regulations, check your local bait and tackle shop or myfwc.com. If you're looking for that pot of gold, it's in the water! Happy St. Patrick's Day on the Treasure Coast and *keep Pullin Drag!*











Easy Breakfast Ideas

Eggs are a staple of my diet, and while I eat plenty for lunch and dinner, they're still most often seen on my breakfast table. Mexican Egg Casserole



- 1 dozen eggs, beaten
- 1 16-ounce carton of sour cream
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon white pepper
- 1 small can of diced chilies
- pound cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 jar green chili salsa

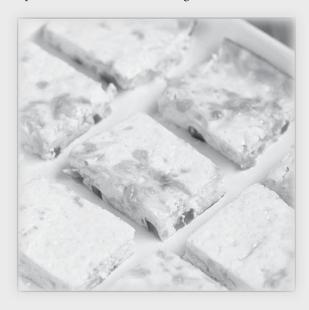

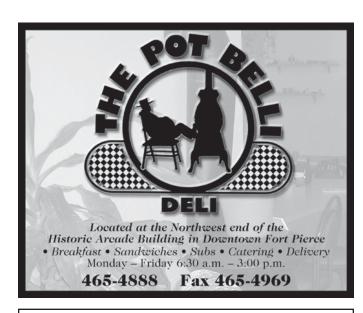

- 1 6-ounce can evaporated milk
- eggs

Mix cheeses and put half on bottom of 9 x 12 pan. Layer peppers on top of the cheese and put on rest of cheese. Beat milk and eggs, pour over top. Bake one hour until light brown at 350 degrees. Cool one hour before cutting into squares. *Serves 8 to10*.

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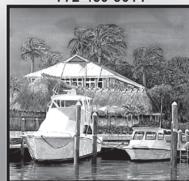

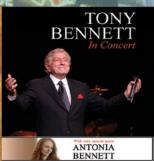
