3rd Annual Fort Pierce Blessing of the Fleet on March 7th



arch is a busy month in the *City of Fort Pierce* and at the **Fort Pierce Yacht Club!** With our part-time members here and visitors in the area, it is the perfect time to rachet up our activities on and off the water.

We kick the month off with a *Dock Party* for area boaters (free and open to non-member boat owners), to be held on March 1st. Snacks, cash bar and lots of like-kind people to meet and greet will make for a great party outside on our patio and deck. The Club will familiarize attendees with activities that our Club has to offer "on the water" and the socializing we do off the water. There will be a raffle for a 4-month affiliate membership in the Club and a free entry into our fundraiser *On the Water Poker Run*, as well as a prize for the best dressed boater. If you own a boat, come by land or sea at 5 p.m. and join the festivities!

On March 11th, *Boating Women's Meet and Greet* kicks off our *Women Boater's Week*. Wednesday evening at 5 p.m., we invite all the women in the area who would like to meet other women boaters. There will be a cash bar, snacks and great conversation, and a raffle for a 4-month affiliate membership and for a free entry into the *On the Water Poker Run*. We don't know how this first-time gathering will evolve — into a quarterly social gathering? with speakers? with training for women? We want you to tell us!

If you are a woman sailor who owns a sailboat, join us on March 14th for our annual *Betty Jo Memorial Offshore Sailboat Race*. We will have approximately eight female-skippered boats competing in a 6.8- to 11.2-mile offshore course with a staggered start. Men are welcome aboard, but we encourage no more than 40% males. We have one all-women crew registered for the event. If you don't own a boat, you can skipper in the race, then message us through our FaceBook page for a crew spot. All participants are welcome to our celebratory dinner on March 15th which will be a Low Country Boil.

On March 19, we will hold our monthly *Third Thursday Eco Evenings* talk — and this month our final speaker of the season will Billy Stover from NSAS speaking on "Tracking Earth's Vanishing Resources" from space. This will be amazing!

Our 3rd Annual On the Water Poker Run will be held on



March 22nd. This poker run is a fun day out on the water, gathering cards at docks from Causeway Cove Marina in the south to Harbor Branch in the north. We also offer a paddle course that will originate in Inlet Park; paddle boards and kayaks have been donated for the event by **Lisa's Kayaks**. Mayor's Message Keeping Fort Pierce and Our Waterways Clean



Thanks to a grant from Wells Fargo, Blue Tube devices that hold plastic bags used to clean trash are being installed along the Indian River Lagoon and Moore's Creek. The use of plastic bags, like those supplied by grocery and other retail stores, will keep those bags out of the Lagoon, and will

allow and encourage walkers and volunteers to pick up trash and debris along the linear parks on the Lagoon and Moore's Creek.

The City of Fort Pierce sought and received support for the Blue Tube Project from the Fort Pierce Yacht Club, A.E. Backus Museum, the Manatee Observation and Education Center (MOEC), St. Andrew's Episcopal Academy and Men of the Sword, a volunteer group that already holds quarterly





cleanups along Moore's Creek, in conjunction with the *Marine Cleanup Initiative*, *City of Fort Pierce* and St. Lucie County. *Blue Tubes* are planned at **St. Andrews Episcopal Academy**, *St. Lucie County Kilmer Library*, **City Marina**, **MOEC**, **River Walk Center**, **Fort Pierce Yacht Club**, **Fisherman's Wharf**, and 7th, 9th and 10th Streets along Moore's Creek.

Blue Tubes have been installed at South Beach Parks and have proved to be successful in keeping beach parks clean. The beach Blue Tubes were paid for by the Fort Pierce South Beach Association (FPSBA). Volunteers for FPSBA work year-round to clean parks and beaches. Their hours are tracked and reported to the City of Fort Pierce. In 2018, volunteers worked enough hours for a full-time employee, and 2019 volunteer hours surpassed 2018.

The City of Fort Pierce plans Great American Cleanup on March 7, 2020, 8 a.m. to 12 noon. Volunteers will meet at the Fort Pierce Recreation Center 903 S. 21st St., for registration and work on projects throughout the city. In addition, Corridor Cleanups have been held at U.S. #1 and K Mart Plaza and 25th Street and Dreamland Park. Corridor Cleanups are scheduled for April 18 on North U.S. #1 and City Hall and on July 25, at Indian River Drive and Veterans Memorial Park. Students who participate in these cleanups earn community service hours.

Taking a walk along Lagoon and Moore's Creek linear parks? Take along a plastic bag and pick up trash (wear gloves for your safety), or deposit the bag in any of the *Blue Tubes* along your way. Anita Prentice Fort Pierce Art Trail

ain Street Fort Pierce presents the **L** Fort Pierce Art Trail hosted by Anita Prentice. This is a unique opportunity to get to know Anita and her vast collection of art in Fort Pierce. She has completed over 175 Mosaic benches and so much more. Spend the morning exploring sites where Anita has her artwork installed.

Attendees will meet at Anita's studio in Historic Casa Caprona. This is the location that Anita Prentice creates the magic. See her workspace, where the materials are stored and the tools that Anita uses to create the beautiful painted mosaics.

Then on to *Highwaymen* gravesites in Pine Grove Cemetery. Anita has adorned them with copies of the deceased's artwork. You will visit the graves of Alfred Hair, Livingston "Castro" Roberts, John Maynor and Carnell "Pete" Smith.

The next stop will be the mural of a Royal Poinciana Tree honoring the Highwaymen at the Intermodal Transit Station. A mosaic and 26 plaques, each with a single name, are located on the west wall of the Station dedicated

on August 23, 2011. The work is a collaborative effort of Anita Prentice and Pat Cochran.

On to the Platts/Backus House for a private tour. Fort Pierce's first doctor built the house in 1895. Then artist Beanie Backus lived there from 1960 – 1990. This is now the office of *Main Street Fort Pierce*. Anita created the beautiful mosaic door mat at the home's entrance.

Next stop, Veterans Memorial Park on North Indian River Drive. Local artist Ginny Piech-Street and Anita collaborated on memorial benches of the various military branches.

Last is a trip over the bridge to South Jetty Park where we will view 16 benches with indigenous fish and 2 memorial benches.

Anita Prentice's *Fort Pierce Art Trail* is offered on two dates: Friday, March 6th and Saturday, March 7th. This 2½ hour tour starts at 10:00 a.m. at Casa Caprona. The cost is \$15 per person. Registration is required. Payment is due at time of registration. Call *Main Street Fort Pierce* at (772) 466-3880.

Registration is limited to 20 attendees. Carpooling is encouraged. There is very little walking as we will be driving to each stop. Lunch is not included but there are four great restaurants at the South Jetty to choose from: Taco Dive, Hurricane Grill, Square Grouper and Rhum Cay.





The Backus Museum Welcomes Home Famed Florida Artist James F. Hutchinson For Special Exhibition "Visionary Truths"

Plorida Artists Hall of Fame inductee James F. Hutchinson returns to the **Backus Museum** for a special exhibition of his majestic oil paintings. "James F. Hutchinson: Visionary Truths" opens Friday, February 21 and continues through Sunday, April 26. The exhibition's opening reception will be held on Friday, March 13 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m., with the artist in attendance. Members may attend the reception free; not-yet members \$20. The Museum is located at 500 North Indian River Drive in Historic Downtown Fort Pierce.

Years before the first Florida Highwayman found his way to Fort Pierce, a striking woman entered the studio at 103 Avenue C with her teenaged brother in tow. The talented teen was a bright young Jim Hutchinson, led there by his older sister, Patricia (or "Patsy"), who was looking for lessons to encourage the artistic talents of the boy. Patsy made an impression on the resident artist, A.E. "Bean" Backus, and on that day in 1948, he opened his studio to the youngster, even though Backus was not known for giving the kind of step-by-step lessons a student might expect. Jim Hutchinson maintained that maybe Bean was more interested in courting his sister than teaching him to paint. Despite this, immersed in a creative environment and under the watchful eye of a master artist, Hutchinson honed his sight and skills, developing into a gifted artist in his own right. Hutchinson, like so many others, traced his beginnings to the open-door policy of Bean Backus. Two years after that introduction, Patsy and Bean married, starting their own creative partnership, and a few months later Hutchinson graduated from Martin County High School and headed off to college. In 1952, he joined the



U.S. Navy (like his brother-in-law Bean had ten years earlier) for a short stint, then attended The School of Illustration and Cartooning in New York City on the G.I. Bill to further refine his skills. Returning home in 1954, he worked at the original McKee Jungle Gardens as a tour guide and botanist, befriended Waldo Sexton, and in the late 1950s started joining Backus on his regular painting trips to Jamaica. But as his talent continued to grow, he knew that he needed to make his own artistic path beyond Bean's shadow and explore the environment with his own vision, and in his own way.

From 1959–1965, Hutchinson had his most profound and inspiring creative experiences to date as an artist, experiences that would resonate within him for the rest of his career. Hutchinson and his wife Joan moved west to live among, study, and paint Florida's Seminole and Miccosukee peoples on the Brighton Reservation/Big Cypress Reservation. This was a transformational moment in time, as their traditional customs and lifestyles were



beginning to drift and yield to the dominant modern culture of 1960s Florida. During this period, Hutchinson became close friends with many of the Seminole elders, including Billy Bowlegs, Charlie Cypress, Charlotte Tommy, and Billy Osceola. In 1971, Hutchinson received a major grant from the Arthur Vining Davis Foundations to paint 50 works representing the Seminole culture, producing a significant body of work that documented and celebrated the distinctiveness of these Native Americans. The State of Florida arranged for the paintings to go to the state capitol, and later travel throughout the state. From 1975–79, Hutchinson was asked to serve on the state Council of Indian Affairs due to his extensive experiences and advocacy for the Seminole peoples. And in 1980, his art again was used to represent the state, when a set of lithographs of Hutchinson's Seminole War Leaders was given to dignitaries during Governor Bob Graham's visit to Europe.

For nearly twenty more years he continued to paint his home state, as well as other places that would inspire him. In 1998, he and his family decided to embark on a new artistic adventure, moving to the Big Island of Hawai'i, where his keen observer's eye and affinity and respect for indigenous peoples led him to study the lush landscapes of the island chain, and the culture and beauty of the native Hawaiians. Shortly after Hutchinson was inducted in 2011 into the Florida Artists Hall of Fame, he decided that after fourteen years living in Hawai'i, it was time to return home, and found his way back to Sewall's Point, where he continues to paint in his studio residence. "Jim Hutchinson is almost a legendary artist these days," says Backus Museum director J. Marshall Adams. "He's enjoyed a long and creatively vibrant career. His art has brought fresh and important appreciation for the beauty of our natural environment, for the respect and dignity of Native Americans, and his compelling and sensitive vision has represented the State of Florida at home and abroad. He has traveled far and wide in those years, but we're pleased to welcome him 'home' in this exhibition, to where it all began."

James F. Hutchinson: Visionary Truths features more than 30 oil paintings that present the exquisite variety of scenes from Florida, Hawai'i, Jamaica, and the American West, as well as perceptive Seminole portraits and glimpses of a vanished way of life, all rendered with deep and genuine insight by a modern master. James F. Hutchinson: Visionary Truths is on view February 21 − April 26. For more information, please visit www.BackusMuseum.org. Fort Pierce Memories

100 years ago...

A.K. Wilson Sells Out His Four Newspapers

The News Printing company, publishers of the Fort Pierce News, of which R.H. Glenn is president and editor, has purchased the St. Lucie County Tribune, semi-weekly, the Stuart Messenger and the Fellsmere Tribune, weeklies, from A.K. Wilson and will continue publication of the four newspapers. The plants are valued at \$10,000.

It is understood that the News Printing company will begin the publication of a daily in December or January to run during the tourist season each year, until conditions warrant an all-year daily.

The recent cold snap wrought great damage to early truck and citrus fruit extending throughout the central part and into southern Florida. Temperatures of 34 above at Miami, and 32 at Tampa established – new records and inflicted losses estimated at \$5,000,000. The temperature at Fort Pierce reached a low record of 38 above zero.

75 years ago...

Fort Pierce Amphibious Base Will Observe Third Birthday

As the Amphibious Training Command of the U.S. Atlantic Fleet observes its third anniversary today, alumni of this base in Florida waters are in action in war theatres around the world, Capt. Clarence Gulbranson, USN, commanding officer of the U.S. Naval Amphibious Training Base here, said Thursday.

Underwater demolition teams trained here cleared Jap-placed obstacles from the beaches at Iwo Jima, and assault boat officers and crews from flotillas trained at Fort Pierce were among those that successfully put the Marines ashore there, Capt. Culbranson said.

There was word, too, that other assault boat forces, trained here at Fort Pierce, were participating in amphibious crossings of the Rhine as Gen. Eisenhower's massed armies pressed for a final decision in the war with Germany.

The Amphibious Training Command, that has trained more than 400,000 officers and men who have already spearheaded 35 major invasions, was set up by Rear Adm. Roland W. Brainard, USN acting under dispatch orders, on March 16, 1942, at Norfolk, VA.

The Fort Pierce Base was commissioned by Capt. Gulbranson -

who has been its only commanding officer – on Jan. 26, 1943, and has trained thousands of assault boat personnel; together with demolitionaires and scouts and raiders...

The anniversary day, on Friday, will be observed here with a public ceremony, at Jaycee Field, at which awards and citations will be presented to men who have earned them in action and are now on duty here, Capt. Gulbranson said.

Capt. Gulbranson, veteran of 36 years in the Naval service, established the base here after serving as commodore of a transport division during the North African landings.

He has remained in command at the USNATB during its expansion and growth, during which it has become much larger than the St. Lucie County countyseat that is its official host. The intensive Base training program is carried on at North and South Island camp sites, just offshore, and isolated for more than two years.

The Navy Legion of Merit was recently awarded to Capt. Gulbranson for "exceptionally outstanding service" in training invasion boat crews for overseas amphibious operations against enemy-held shores...

Training of the LCM and LCVP crews is centered here...

Training given here is principally devoted to manning the 50-foot LCM, or tank lighter used in unloading transports and in carrying medium equipment ashore, and the 36-foot LCVP, that takes soldiers or Marines ashore in assault waves.




Tips & Tricks

In my former life I was a Computer Consultant & Instructor in the Corporate sector. I've taught Microsoft software for over 30 years. Over the next year, I will share with you Microsoft Tips & Tricks.

CUT & PASTE

These shortcuts will work in almost all software, not just Microsoft products.



Keyboard Shortcuts: Ask anyone who knows these shortcuts — Ctrl + C to Copy, Ctrl + V to Paste, and Ctrl + X to Cut — and they will testify to their critical timesaving nature. (On Macintosh products, use the COM-

MAND key instead of the CONTROL key.)

Technique: Select the text you wish to Cut or Copy. In this case we will copy. Hold down your CONTROL Key and Tap C. Move your cursor to where you want to place the text and hold down your CONTROL Key and press V to paste.

USING THE CLIPBOARD

I just used this the other day. I t is so handy when you want to move around chunks of text. Most folks have noticed Clipboard on the ribbon but really don't understand its use. The Office Clipboard allows you to copy up to 24 items from Office documents or other

programs and paste them into another Office document. For example, you can copy text from an e-mail message, data from a workbook or datasheet, and a graphic from a presentation, and then paste them all into a document. By using the Office Clipboard, you can arrange the copied items the way that you want in the document.

Technique: Open the Clipboard by clicking the down-right arrow next to Clipboard.

The Clipboard displays. Now use what you learned above to copy text. Select text, hold down the Control Key and Press C. Note the text you selected is now placed on the Clipboard. Do this several more times. Notice more items are placed on Clipboard. In this example I have 4 paragraphs on the Clipboard.

You can paste into the same document, another document or another program. Just position your cursor where you want to paste and click the text you wish to paste.



The Perfect Blanched Asparagus

Trimming: There are two methods for trimming asparagus. You can simply snap off the woody ends wherever they naturally break. This is super easy, but there is some waste. Or, peel the woody outer bits with a vegetable peeler. Not only will they look beautiful, but you'll be saving some of the asparagus you would otherwise be throwing away!

Cooking: Next, bring a large pot of salted water to a boil then add cleaned asparagus. Cook 1 minute. There will be no need to shock in cold water to stop the cooking process. The asparagus comes out perfect every time. This tip is from my good friend Jane Rowley.

Seasoning: Here are some ideas for flavors that will complement your roasted asparagus. Keep it simple and choose just one or two. Or go all-out like I did and use all four of the first ideas.

- ~ Sprinkle of finely grated Parmesan cheese
- ~Light drizzle of balsamic reduction or thick balsamic vinegar
- ~ Toasted sliced almonds



Get Lucky ... Go Fishing!



arch is a great time to try your luck at fishing! The Treasure Coast is known for fantastic fishing and if you're not on the water, you're missing all the fun. Inshore and offshore anglers are catching sails, redfish, cobia, snapper, tarpon, snook, and sheepshead. Sailfish are large pelagic bill-fish and Florida's state saltwater fish. Try for these lively fish by trolling offshore using mullet or naked ballyhoo. Their enlarged bright blue dorsal fin runs almost the entire length of the fish. Watch for this dorsal fin to break water as they feed. Be quick to release this catch for adequate revival.

Snook are still highly prized for the fight and the later feast. Your best chance to land one of these linesiders is live finger mullet, pilchards or artificials. Look for current and structure when targeting snook. Permit have been active inshore and near shore especially in sandy waters and shallow reefs. Use live shrimp or blue crabs and get ready for some great permit action. Permit size must be not less than 11 inches or more than 22 inches fork length. Try grilling, baking, or frying for your permit dinner.

Check with your local bait and tackle shops for more rules and regulations. So have some fun hooking a great fish and then sharing the freshest fish dinner you could ever have. Hope your St. Patrick's Day includes a bit of luck *Pullin Drag!*




Grilled Asparagus with Gorgonzola Butter

- 34 cup (loosely packed) crumbled Gorgonzola cheese
- 6 tablespoons (34 stick) butter, room temperature
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 pounds asparagus, trimmed

Stir Gorgonzola cheese, butter and lemon juice in medium bowl to blend. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Cover and refrigerate. (Gorgonzola butter can be prepared two days ahead. Keep refrigerated.)

Prepare barbecue (high heat). Whisk oil, basil and garlic to blend in small bowl. Spread out asparagus in single layer in baking dish. Pour oil mixture over asparagus and turn to coat. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Transfer asparagus to barbecue. Grill until charred on all sides, turning occasionally, about four minutes. Transfer to plates. Top asparagus with some Gorgonzola butter and serve. *Serves 8*.






