



Your elected city officials devote far more hours to the job of serving their constituents than many of our citizens realize. Often, it is a real surprise after election for the newcomer to city commission and mayor.

What the interested Fort Pierce

voter sees is the three meetings held every month in the commission chambers and *Fort Pierce Redevelopment* meetings,

available on video. What is not very visible are the other commitments each elected official must keep during the month, in order to represent our city throughout St. Lucie County. Each January, the Commission decides these committee assignments.



Commissioners Curtis

and Jeremiah Johnson serve on the *Transportation Planning Organization* (TPO), Commissioner Curtis Johnson and I serve on the *St. Lucie Fire Board*; Commissioners Broderick and Gaines serve on the *Retirement Board*.

Commissioner Jeremiah Johnson serves on the *Tourist Development Council*, and as ex officio on the *Main Street Board* and the *St. Lucie Chamber of Commerce*. He also meets with the *Downtown Business Alliance*.

Commissioner Curtis Johnson, Jr. serves on the Roundtable

and the *Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council*, as well as the *Port Advisory Committee* and the *St. Lucie Land Acquisition and Selection Committee*.

Commissioner Arnold Gaines serves on the *Treasure Coast Council of Local Governments*, the *Council on Aging, St. Lucie Homeless Committee*, the *Treasure Coast Education, Research and Development Authority* (TCERDA), and as ex officio on the *Lincoln Park Main Street* Board.

Commissioner Broderick serves on the Parking Committee,

the Sunrise Theatre Advisory Board, and meets with the Orange Avenue Business Corridor Association. He is also liaison with the Florida Municipal Power Association (FMPA) and the Florida Municipal Education Association (FMEA).

As Mayor, I serve on the Fort Pierce Utility Author-

ity ((FPUA). I also serve on the Florida League of Cities, the Treasure Coast Regional League of Cities, and Florida Municipal Insurance Trust (FMIT). I also host Coffee With The Mayor monthly.

Meetings with constituents and personal appearances must be scheduled around these assignments, as well as our own business and personal lives. Our positions are supposed to be part time. If you're planning to run for office, know and understand what you've signed up for. ��

## City of Fort Pierce Launches Assessment Survey for Community Development Block Grant

The City of Fort Pierce anticipates the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will allocate approximately \$564,875 to the City of Fort Pierce for the fiscal program year, October 2023–2024 for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.

The *City of Fort Pierce* is developing its 2023–2024 Annual Action Plan to detail the proposed use of the CDBG funds during the program year, which begins October 1, 2023, and ends September 30, 2024. The Action Plan represents Year #3 of 2021–2025, 5-Year Consolidated Plan previously reviewed by citizens and approved by the City Commission. The Action Plan will outline issues and opportunities facing Fort Pierce and address matters such as infrastructure, public and assisted housing, and economic and community development.

Fort Pierce city residents and public service providers are encouraged to take the Community Needs Assessment Survey, online or in hard copy. A survey in English or Spanish can be

easily accessed on the City website at https://www.surveymon-key.com/r/S9YC9LX

Survey results will be automatically tabulated and listed in the 2023–2024 Annual Action Plan which will help set the framework for community, housing, and economic development projects for Fort Pierce during the next fiscal year.

**The Tierney & Wetzel Foundation**: The **Tierney and Wetzel Foundation** was established in November 2021 following the sale of **Sunrise Ford**, one of St. County's oldest family-owned businesses. Founded in 1932, **Sunrise Ford** was also a strong supporter of local non-profits and charitable organizations.

**Sunrise Ford's** owner, Mary Jo Tierney, and her husband, Mike Wetzel, vice-president of the dealership, wanted to continue that legacy through their foundation.

"For decades the community was very supportive of Sunrise Ford, making it one of the top volume Ford dealers in the area, so we wanted to continue to contribute to local causes," Tierney said. The foundation has donated to groups that the dealership supported for years, including the A.E. Backus Museum, *Main Street Fort Pierce*, *WPSL Christmas Kids*, providing funds for school supplies and swimming lessons for needy children, and the *St. Lucie County Education Foundation*.

The *Tierney and Wetzel Foundation* has also taken up a new cause focusing on efforts to restore the Indian River Lagoon by curtailing pollutants flowing into Treasure Coast waterways from Lake Okeechobee and other agricultural canal systems. The foundation teamed up with *Friends of the Everglades* and *Vote Water* to fund a legislative accountability project, which tracks proposed federal, state and local laws that can be detrimental to the health of the lagoon. "We also want to see who the politicians and lobbyists are pushing these policies so the public can be educated about what can be done to stop them from becoming law," Wetzel said.

Of particular concern this legislative session, is a proposed bill that would strip cities and counties from regulating their waterways and wetlands. The state would take over and could undermine stricter restrictions imposed by local governments.

"That could be devastating considering all of the other progrowth legislation under consideration this session," Wetzel said.

Friends of the Everglades, based in Stuart, also is promoting more aggressive monitoring of pollutants in waterways and enforcing policies to reduce them. Early in his first administration, Governor Ron DeSantis established the Blue Green Algae Task Force, made up of scientists and other experts, who made dozens of recommendations on how to curb pollutants in waterways throughout the state. "Most of those recommendations were ignored since they were released two years ago. It's time for the governor and state legislators to take a hard look at those recommendations and implement them," Tierney said.

When **Sunrise Ford** was founded more than 90 years ago by the Sneed family, the Indian River was pristine and Fort Pierce was a small town, but had a burgeoning citrus industry and beautiful beaches. Much has changed since then, but Tierney and Wetzel hope their foundation will help environmental groups in their efforts to restore the lagoon so it continues to have an abundance of fish species that makes it one of the most biodiverse estuarine ecosystems in North America.

#### A New Way to Get Around Fort Pierce is Free, On-Demand, and 100% Electric

peginning March 9th, there is a new and eco-friendly way **D** to get around Ft. Pierce. In partnership between the *City* of Ft. Pierce and the Fort Pierce Redevelopment Agency, the launch of Freebee has been announced — the city's free, ondemand, 100% electric transportation service.

The goal of the program is to provide connectivity within the CRA and business district that will be a huge economic development driver for the local business community while also filling mobility gaps, easing traffic congestion, and stress on parking demands. Whether for work, appointments, or play, Freebee will pick passengers up at their doorsteps and safely deliver them to their destination of choice within the service zone. The current service area encompasses downtown Fort Pierce and stretches across the bridge to the north end of the island on the beachside. It includes notable destinations like the Sunrise Theatre, St. Lucie County Aquarium, and Jetty Park.

The highly anticipated service is a welcome addition and will be a game changer for the City of Fort Pierce. Previous service launches in other municipalities have proven to increase economic development, help decrease traffic congestion, provide equitable transportation to all, and reduce carbon emissions through the usage of 100% battery-powered vehicles.

Users can access a *Freebee* ride in three simple steps:

1: Download the *Ride Freebee* mobile app on the App Store or Google Play. Users in need of accessibility accommodations or who do not have a smartphone can call (855) 918-3733 to request a ride.

2: Request a pickup at your location and select a destination from an array of interesting places to explore on the Freebee app or enter the address of their desired location.

**3:** Enjoy the *free* ride!



shop are under \$30 and there are so many things to choose from. I walked out with some cute new barrettes and makeup sponges.



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

# A New View: Rediscover the Backus Portfolio on Paper and Canvas in the Special Exhibition *Fine Print,* March 3—April 30

The next exhibition of the 2022-23 season at the A.E. Backus Museum & Gallery provides a unique view of A.E. Backus's work. Fine Print: Rediscovering the Backus Portfolio on Paper and Canvas focuses on a very prominent limitededition print portfolio titled "Florida and the West Indies - Sketches by A.E. Backus." What makes this exhibition so special is that the original



sketches have been paired with paintings from public and private collections that connect with the portfolio images. The exhibition will be on view from March 3 through April 30 at the Backus Museum located at 500 North Indian River Drive in Historic Downtown Fort Pierce.


The story of the prized limited-edition portfolio "Florida and the West Indies - Sketches by



A.E. Backus" is revisited in Fine Print for the 50th anniversary of its publication. These exceptional images were drawn from and inspired by the artist's travels over nearly twenty years and gathered in 1972 as a high-quality portfolio. This assembly reveals Backus' deep connection to the places and people he encountered. 16 of the original drawings are part of the Museum's permanent collection, and are presented together for the first time since the limited-edition folio was published.

These singular drawings from the Backus Portfolio are displayed in conversation with colorful, rarely seen oil paintings that showcase the artist's inspiration and creative process. The 40 works in the exhibition are grouped into the geographical subject categories of the original portfolio, with contextual information provided for each. Those categories include Florida; the Everglades; the Bahamas; Hispaniola (Haiti and the Dominican Republic); and Jamaica. The collection of drawings and paintings breathe new life into the classic 18 prints known and cherished for generations.





"Fifty years ago, there were originally 999 portfolio sets that were offered for \$20 as an early fundraiser for the forerunner of today's Backus Museum," explains J. Marshall Adams, Executive Director. "Because the portfolio's images were loose, people separated them over the years to frame individually or give as gifts. Today many people love the prints, routinely mistaking them for original sketches because of their high-quality production. But the memory of the original portfolio has dimmed a bit. It felt like it was time to bring them together once more and discover new and forgotten insights into the artist's extraordinary and beloved work."

The Members Opening Reception for Fine Print: Rediscovering the Backus Portfolio on Paper and Canvas is scheduled for Friday, March 17 from 6:00-8:00 p.m., free of charge to Museum Members, notyet members \$20 (or join at the door and enjoy free access to all exhibitions and receptions for the year).

Well, it has been several months since I have last written for *The Focus* and it is with a bit of trepidation that I write this article. Frankly, I have missed you all and I have missed the privilege of being a moment in your life. Typically, I like to share fun, happy, upbeat and maybe even motivating snippets. The fun, happy upbeat and moti-

vated elements of my life have diminished a bit lately and I am struggling to fan the flames. Six months ago my husband got hit by a car while we were biking.

A year ago we started pretty hard core biking for "people our age." It was a blast. Ever increasing distances and speed were accomplished. We were looking and feeling pretty darn good! Then, one Saturday morning a pickup ran a stop sign. A sickening thud was heard, followed by heart-wrenching moaning and ambulance sirens. Fortunately, and I do say fortunately, or by the grace of God, immediate surgery to repair a badly broken leg followed and this was the extent of the physical injuries. The course over the past six months has been, first bed, then a wheelchair, followed by crutches and now walking, although it be a bit like Herman Munster. Pain is a constant companion and much progress lies ahead.

In the midst of all this, I did decide to conquer my demons and ride again, despite the sound of the thud of my husband getting hit still visiting me in my dreams. This is the truly ironic part. I hit an obstacle in the road and went flying. In the time it took for me to hit the pavement, my mind rapidly calculated the scenario and I knew it was not good. I lay in the road for a while unable to get up and unable to reach my phone attached to my bike. The next little scenario shows the strength and multidimensional mind of a woman. In what seemed like a very long time, under the circumstances, a neighbor, who I had in the past, just said quick friendly hellos to, came by on her bike, assessed the situation and got me to the hospital in quick order, having the foresight to swing by her house on the way and grab a string cheese because she is hypoglycemic and did not want to faint on her watch.

I felt a bit like a lost child in the hospital alone, as my neighbor had to go home to care for responsibilities there and hubby had not yet ventured out solo. At the hospital I was treated with kindness. Warm blankets were brought to combat the shaking chills.

Well, long story short, a separated shoulder, broken collar bone and rib, with bruises to make a brawler proud, was the extent of the damage. Again, very fortunate.

So, to paint the picture, I come home from the hospital to hubby in a wheel chair, can't lift anything, arm in a sling, quite miserable and pretty much glued to the recliner. It felt bleak and a new layer of pain settled over our home. Yet there was brightness, some order amidst chaos. Gratefully, just before my mishap I had rearranged the house, removing furniture that was in the way of a wheel chair and lowering things in the kitchen so hubby could reach everything he might want. So, when duty called, he was able to navigate our home, keep us in clean clothes and rustle up some fantastic meals. Brad's clearance to drive coincided exactly with being able to come get me at the hospital (a wonderful sight) and my no-driving restriction of six weeks. Greater adversity was met with greater strength. Here's testimony to stepping up to the plate when needed! We saddled up together, with very few melt downs. We ate delicious healthy meals, good for the body and soul. We watched ridiculous comedies to entice our funny bone to find joy and spread it throughout our bodies. We sat in our front drive where the sun shines, ignoring how pathetic we looked, with our little Rosy dog contentedly curled up in her fluffy doggy bed at our feet and we took rides to the jetty to watch the fishermen. Our big outing was the grocery store, which was a major undertaking. One thing we do know for sure is that our new marriage has held up well during these unusual times.

Hubby is now six months in and I am four months in with the recent news that I will need intervention to repair complications, so there is still a project ahead of me. Why share all of this? Because we are all fragile and human. Being human can be very messy and very hard. It may sound trite, but a little bit of kindness goes a long way. Brad and I both look pretty good right now and passing by us you would not guess the daily pain, sometimes despair and concerns that are a present. Everyone is bruised in some ways and we all brush up against each other day to day. We have the opportunity to sooth each other or abrade each other and it is difficult to be conscious, especially since we all have our stuff going on. Patience, insight, love and humility are the finest of balms of which I know. Let's amply and abundantly pour this out into the world at the highest level we are able. As one accesses these traits they grow and sooth the giver and the receiver. Thank you for the visit. I'll see you again next month! �

#### A Salty Spring

ome say spring is in the air, but I say it's in the water! As the Winds calm down and the weather gets nicer, opportunities to catch great fish only get better. Inshore and offshore anglers are finding success with sails, mahi, cobia, snapper, snook, and sheepshead.

Snapper and sheepshead fishing continue to provide steady action on the nearshore reefs with some good-sized ones being reported. Target sheepshead with live shrimp early in the morning as the sun comes up. I like to use light tackle with 30-pound fluorocarbon leader and a quarter ounce jig. For many anglers, snook fishing continues to be a main focus, especially on the incoming and outgoing tides in the inlet and around the jetties. Pilchards, threadfins, and croakers are primary bait choices for landing one of these prized linesiders. Keep the drag set tight as these fighters are good at breaking off around pilings, docks, and other structures.

Offshore, the bite is heating up for kingfish, mahi, and some cobia. I find trolling ballyhoo with skirts is the best chance for hooking a high-flying and fighting mahi. Chumming with





some cut bait near the school of mahi will also increase your chances for bringing home one of the tastiest fish in the sea.

#### Fort Pierce Martial Arts Students Win Competitions




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
