

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Main Street Fort Pierce Continues its Commitment to Revitalization

In this article I'd like to follow up on the November issue of the Focus and finish out the year talking about Main Street's approach to our community's revitalization using the four points approach of The Main Street Approach: Economic Vitality, Design, Promotion, and Organization. In this article we will finish the year out discussing the remaining two of the four points, Design and Promotion. These two approaches often come hand in hand.

DESIGN supports a community's transformation by enhancing the physical and visual assets that set the commercial district apart. Main Street Fort Pierce purchased the **Sunrise Theatre** building and began renovation in 1997 then in 1999 purchased the entire property. *Main Street* donated the Theatre to the City who has now taken over the daily operations.

Main Street worked with St. Lucie County to achieve a library grant for the construction of a \$2,500,000 library in downtown Fort Pierce.

A great example of how *Main Street* enhanced downtown Fort Pierce while showcasing the community's unique characteristics can be seen by the murals in historic downtown. *Main Street* organized the *St. Lucie Mural Society* to create these incredible murals. A most resent event was the *Fish Fence* activity, which was an ongoing event that lasted over a two year period. If you drove by the **King's Landing** project on 2nd Street, you saw all the brightly color painted wooden fish. This fence was designed by a plethora of people of all ages and showcased the communities' unique characteristics through color and design.

Each year Colleen chooses an artist who has never shown their work before. Rosalie Knoelke Arnold is 90 years young and paints with enthusiasm each and every day. As a young girl, Rosalie's family moved next door to A.E. Backus in downtown Fort Pierce. Every day after school Rosalie went over the "Beanie's" house and painted in his studio, now known as the home of *Main Street Fort Pierce*. Rose later received an art scholarship to the University of Miami but her father would not allow her to attend telling her that she had to stay home and work in the family jewelry store. Rosalie has been working

in **Sweet's Jewelers** nearly her entire life. At the age of 84, Rosalie once again picked up a paint brush and there is no stopping her now!

Fine water colorist artist, Colleen Nash Becht grew up on Florida's Treasure Coast. Her talent and eye for creating photorealistic paintings of the region's coastal life has garnered and continues to garner her domestic and international awards.

Colleen's watercolors are intricate and detailed, often hyper-realistic renditions done at close range. She is especially talented at capturing illumination from organic sunlight, showing how the light dances upon a subject. Her subject matter ranges from native tropical flora, still life fruits, and wildlife to commissioned portraits and her latest obsession, small wooden boats.

Her work is collected and sold in galleries from Palm Beach to San Francisco; and in coastal towns around the world. Collectors range from billionaires and celebrities to local fishermen and school teachers, with many of them owning original pieces.

We are Bringing Back the TIKI YIBE Here at Cobb's Landing!

Since the teardown of the beloved "Tiki Bar" in the summer of 2019, residents and visitors alike have been reminiscing and hoping for a new tiki to be built at the Fort Pierce City Marina. Although Cobb's Landing has a smaller tiki bar and dining room, we have decided to build a larger tiki area and recapture the downtown tiki atmosphere that we lost in 2019.

The new tiki structure will be 1,800 sq. ft. and cover the existing **Cobb's Landing** patio area along the west side of the **City Marina**. The new addition is being built by **Seminole Tiki Huts** with construction starting November 7th and expected to be completed by the first of December. Longtime Fort Pierce resident and **Cobb's Landing** owner Donna Qvarnstrom, "We are always thinking about bettering our community and improving the downtown Fort Pierce area; evolving and growing with the times and making this area a "must-see Florida destination" for everyone." Mayor's Message City and FPRA Programs Support Small Business

ur city emphasizes helping small businesses succeed in a variety of ways. Here are just a few of them.

The city has continued to support an impact fee moratorium within the Fort Pierce Redevelopment Agency

(FPRA) boundaries.

The Infill Lien Reduction Program promotes reinvestment and revitalization of vacant infill properties by providing the property owner relief from the liens levied prior to their ownership

in exchange for the development of that vacant parcel. Via development agreement, the soft costs associated with city liens will be waived and 50% of the hard costs may be refunded in accordance with the



agreement. There will be specific time parameters associated with obtaining building permits and completing construction to be eligible for the refund. This program will be available on an individual basis.

The *FPRA* has been funding school resource officers in C.A. Moore and Dan McCarty Middle School, but is now funding a downtown police detail during busy times.

The *FPRA* funded commercial façade grants and interior uplift grants for small businesses in the FPRA boundary.

The FPRA's newest program is the Targeted Corridor Paint Program. The intent of the Targeted Corridor Paint Program is to support the revitalization of the commercial corridors in the FPRA district by stimulating private investment in improvements that enhance the appearance of buildings and properties and eliminate blight.

The first phase concentrates on Orange Avenue. The Program offers financial assistance in the form of a reimbursable grant up to \$1,000 toward the cost of exterior paint and paint supplies. The funds will be disbursed on a first-come, first-served basis. Limit one (1) grant award per property. The program

> closed November 3, 2022. To be eligible for this program the property must be located on the Orange Avenue corridor within the FPRA District (between 33rd Street and Melody Lane).

> > The FPRA also

supports Main Street Fort Pierce and Lincoln Park Main Street in their missions to improve business in their respective boundaries.

For over a decade, the City and the *Fort Pierce Redevelop*ment Agency (FPRA) have had minimal funds to support local businesses because the lion's share of Tax Increment Funds (TIF) were needed to pay down debt. It is a welcome change to be able to support our local small businesses with these and other programs. �


Have you ever visited the **Vanishing Mermaid** at the **Manatee Center** in downtown Fort Pierce?


Come to the **Vanishing Mermaid** the next time you are downtown. We are well stocked and waiting to help




Sara Jane & Company — Look, Leap, Love

Where I am From and Where I am Going

Tgrew up in New Britain, Connecticut, in the exact center of the state. It was a large town compared to Fort Pierce and a small town compared to the capitol city of Hartford. It hosted Stanley Works Tool and Dye, where I worked one summer, Central Connecticut State College, which has now

graduated to a State University and a potpourri of small businesses, bars, pool halls and restaurants. New Britian also had some of the most inviting public parks a child could imagine. Rolling hills dotted with ponds and foliage of great variety awakened my love of our earth. Mulberries off the bush, apples plucked from low limbs and cherries, staining fingers red, were seasonal favorites.

Nature was my longing, my home, my nest, my respite from what my childlike heart knew was a bit of insanity in the world, as I watched the news footage of wars, crime and hunger. I could not then, and in all honesty still cannot comprehend man's inhumanity against man. I became acutely aware of moments of blissful peace and clung to them like Rose clung to the floating door in the Titanic.

There are two moments in my childhood that are etched in all of my senses and are often the foundation for my way in the world even now. As a child, my bedroom was on the second floor. From one bedroom window I could see the green patches of the neighborhood yards. From the other bedroom window, I viewed the park across the street, home to a small grove of birch trees which are often featured in my paintings. Summer evenings found the windows open, capturing a light breeze. This evening I was heading off to bed. The sun was kissing the day goodbye, my bedsheets had been line-dried just that afternoon, neighbors had enjoyed the cool of the evening to mow their lawns and the sweet scent of fresh cut grass wafted through my bedroom. Dinner had been baked chicken and potatoes, green beans, fresh milk and something sweet for dessert. My belly was just full enough. All of my senses were embraced in loveliness and the world felt just right, there was nothing that I lacked or desired at that moment beneath the covers, drifting off. Life was good.

The second moment again involves being held in the perfect place. We were at my grandfather's cottage on a lake in Columbia, Connecticut. It is nestled in the countryside and the ideal place to escape the summer heat of the Connecticut valley. It is a sleepy little lake dotted with cottages, row boats, sunfish sailboats, an occasional vintage motorboat and lots of ducks. My four siblings and I shared a bunk style bedroom in this postage stamp of a cottage and the strict rule was no stirring until mom and dad were awake. As the family early bird, I spent many a daybreak watching the lake come to life. One such morning unfolded like this ... que the light fog lifting off the lake, the birds chirping and a family of ducks; momma and her proud little ducklets all neatly lined up behind her, silently paddling by. The mossy scent of daybreak, the light chill of the evening past, and the gentle stirring of human and animal life coming into a new day was so profoundly beautiful to my little self, it has imprinted my soul forever. It taught me that despite what goes on around us, there is beauty and there is hope. All of this I felt as a child.

This brings me to where I am going. I have the privilege of making art for a living. I get to talk to people every day about beauty, hope and safety. My paintings are my words. I share that despite what goes on around us, there is a strain of "something" that runs deep. When we seek it and find it, it connects us to something akin to my childhood moments of pure contentment, bliss, awe, and beauty. I have been able to make a space of respite from the world, a space with no thorns, just roses. So, come visit. Escape and indulge, even if just for a moment. •



Wishing for More Fishing!

Old fronts are moving through and the hurricane season is over so we know the fishing will be heating up. Unfortunately, the cold fronts bring a lot of windy conditions and rough seas so if conditions are looking good, seize the day! This is a fantastic time of year to look for migratory fish like cobia, tripletail, and mackerel. Sailfish are also more abundant now and can be caught at about 80 feet and further out.

The powerful pelagic cobia are moving south and highly prized by all anglers as a great fight and a delicious dinner. They are fast growers and can get up to 100 pounds so be prepared with medium to heavy tackle and a strong gaff. They are also known to be aggressive feeders so will take almost any bait from mullet, shrimp, and blue crabs to artificials. Look for them skimming the surface around buoys, wrecks, and floating debris for your best chance at a cobia dinner.

You can still target snook the first of December but the season closes December 15th through January 31st. If the ocean is too rough, snook fishing the Fort Pierce Inlet and around mangroves, bridges, and docks is a good alternative. Try using live mullet, pilchards, or pinfish with a tight drag as these smart line-siders will try to break your line on any nearby structure.



Great Aunt Ceil's Aniseed Cookies by James Taylor

Ingredients


6 eggs
5 Cups Flour
3 tsp Aniseed Oil
5 Cups Flour
3 tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp salt



Instructions

Beat eggs until light and fluffy with a silky texture. You can use a mixer or by hand. Then gradually add the sugar while continuing to mix. Add in the aniseed oil, salt, and baking powder. Continue mixing until thoroughly combined. Gradually add in the flour, one cup at a time. Spoon out onto a lightly greased baking sheet to your desired size. I usually do a heaping tablespoon. Makes about a 2-bite cookie.

Bake at 325° for 25 minutes or until straw colored. Let cool and enjoy!




