

# Mayor's Message City Commission Celebrates One Fort Pierce

ince being elected in 2012, one of Omy main goals is to unite our city. We have two election districts which "divide" Fort Pierce, mostly between North and South Fort Pierce. That divide also results in District 1 being overwhelmingly African American and District 2 made up of a mixture of a number

of groups, but mostly white, Hispanic and increasingly African Americans. The 2020 census numbers show that of the 47,000 people who reside in Fort Pierce, 41.4 % are African Americans, 53.1% are white, which includes Hispanics, who make up 33.5%.

Fort Pierce is one city, as District 1 Commissioner Curtis Johnson, Jr., has said: "We are One Fort Pierce." Commissioner C. Johnson was elected in 2020 and he has brought to our commission intelligence, dedication, civility and levity. Newlyelected District 1 Commissioner Arnold Gaines promises to be a positive reinforcement of the vision of One Fort Pierce. Our entire Commission has signed on to that vision and we wear the lapel pins to prove it.

Fort Pierce has made important commitments to District 1 neighborhoods. Incubate Neighborhood Center has been chosen as the operator for Means Court, an important Lincoln Park community resource center. The Means Court Center will include an incubator for business and a commercial kitchen.

Located between 13th Street and Means Court on Avenue E, Means Court Elementary was an historic school property that once was the site of Lincoln Park Academy, a school of excellence for African Americans during the days of segregation.

The Fort Pierce Redevelopment Agency continues to support the designation of the Jackie Caynon Building at 1234 Avenue D as a *Highwayman Museum*, and the restoration of the Lincoln Theater as a multiuse event center. Further, the city has embarked on a Lincoln Park Overlay District Devel**opment** project along Avenue D to revitalize this once thriving commercial corridor. \*

### Huge Win for Preservation in Florida

The Florida Senate Committee on Commerce and Tourism met and unanimously passed Senate Bill 1310: the Main Street Tourism and Historic Revitalization Act. The bill

provides a 20% tax credit for eligible historic properties being restored and preserved and 30% for those in a *Florida Main Street* designated area.

Speaking at the meeting Committee Vice Chair Senator Tom Wright said, "This is a great bill, and the timing is perfect. It will be a great thing for Florida."

Nearly two dozen *Main Street* representatives and preservationists from around the state were in attendance at the Florida Capitol to support the bill. The nonprofit *1000 Friends of Florida* also spoke in favor of the *Main Street Tourism and Historic Revitalization Act* with Policy and Planning Director Jane West sharing the organization's support for the bill as an important tool to help promote infill development, which is sorely needed in Florida.

"This legislation will kickstart projects and increase economic development in communities throughout Florida," said Melissa Wyllie, CEO and president of the Florida Trust

for Historic Preservation. "This tool will help protect many of Florida's irreplaceable historic resources and ultimately provide jobs and strengthen communities throughout the state."

The next stop for the legislation is the Senate Committee on Finance and Tax, which is chaired by bill sponsor Represen-

tative Ana Maria Rodriguez. The legislation's House companion bill HB 247 is waiting to be added to the agenda in the House Tourism, Energy, and Infrastructure Committee.

Want to be a part of moving this important preservation legislation forward? Please contact the members of that committee and its Chairman Brad Drake to get it heard in committee. You can also reach out to your representative and ask them to cosponsor either the House or Senate Bill. ❖



All proceeds benefit the projects of *Main Street Fort Pierce*, *Inc.*, a 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation. 

## 4th Annual Celebrating Florida Landscapes Show

A rtists Anita Prentice and Doretha Hair Trusdell are excited to be showing together again at their *Fourth Annual "Celebrating Florida Landscapes"* show and sale at *Main Street Fort Pierce* on Thursday, February 10th from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. If you can't make the show on Thursday night there will be a second chance on Friday, February, 11th from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Prentice and Hair Trusdell are pleased to have guest artist master wood turner Jack Shelton exhibiting with them this year. Shelton has been turning and carving wood for over 30 years. He began making utilitarian pieces and then fell deeply in love with the grain, color and feel of wood. In Jack's hands wood is not an inanimate object — it comes alive. His one-of-a-kind works of art have been shown all over the United States and are coveted by collectors worldwide.

You have probably seen and maybe even sat on Prentice's work. She is the mosaic artist responsible for the over 200 mosaic benches placed throughout St. Lucie County including at the Fort Pierce Jetty and Veterans Park. She created a mosaic panda and two mosaic lions in *Heathcote Botanical Gardens' Children's Garden*, soon to be joined by a mosaic gorilla! Prentice also works on a smaller scale and her mosaic landscapes, hibiscus and palm trees can be found hanging in many area homes. A couple of her lady bugs reside in France. Prentice was commissioned to create mosaic grave tributes to a number of the late *Florida Highwaymen*. In fact, that is how she first met Doretha Hair Trusdell, when she added a mosaic of his artwork to the grave marker for Hair Trusdell's first husband, Highwayman Alfred Hair.

Doretha Hair Trusdell was married to a *Highwayman* and is the mother of a second-generation *Highwayman* artist and most importantly, a Florida landscape painter in her own right. Hair Trusdell paints the Florida many of us have seen kayaking, on a hike or driving the back roads; the native landscape before it has been paved or gated. She is an articulate speaker and a driving force behind the effort to have the grassroots legends — the *Florida Highwaymen* — honored with a Florida specialty license plate. Proceeds from plate sales will go towards creating and funding a *Florida Highwaymen Museum* in Fort Pierce.

Hair Trusdell's landscape paintings are sought after and held in many local collections. Her nocturnes, or paintings of nighttime scenes, are especially magical. If you don't have a Doretha Hair Trusdell in your Florida art collection, here is your opportunity to start or add to your collection.


## Backus Museum Presents "The Highwaymen: Art/History"

A closer look at the paintings of the renowned Florida Artists, January 8 through March 6, 2022

The A.E. Backus Museum presents *The Highwaymen:* Art / History, the latest exhibition in its annual series recognizing the accomplishments of the original artists who made their names selling their paintings on Florida's open roads. Drawn from private collections with notable paintings never presented to the public, the

exhibition is on view January 8 through March 6, at 500 North Indian River Drive in Historic Downtown Fort Pierce.

Today, the famed Florida landscape painters, first known in the 1950s as the artists who sold their work from the trunks of their cars, deserve a closer look. Over the years, that humble beginning became the story, often overshadowing their artistic achievements that instinctively echo the same techniques long revered in the art world's most recognized movements and masterpieces. This new survey, including paintings never exhibited, brings to light these outsider artists' innate visions, revealing the inventive style, confident strokes, collaborative spirit, and effective methods that would captivate countless patrons, define their movement, and demand their place in the history of art.






Artists Harold Newton (1934–1994), Alfred Hair (1941–1970), Mary Ann Carroll (1940–2019), James Gibson (1938–2017), R.A. "Roy" McLendon (b.1932), Willie Daniels (1950–2021) and at least 20 others in Fort Pierce and surrounding communities are often described as "untrained" or "self-taught" painters, though it is

well documented that several were students of Lincoln Park Academy's revered art teacher Zanobia Jefferson (1919–2017); many were inspired, encouraged, and learned from Fort Pierce's A.E. "Bean" Backus (1906–1990); and a few went further to take academic art classes and even become art educators as adults. Yet they also learned collectively by experience, sharing and competing with one another to hone their skills and vision.

Paintings by the artists who would become known as The Highwaymen demonstrate special knowledge and techniques that challenge the ideas of their unassuming habits. These artists would optimize their chosen medium of oil painting with "wet-on-wet" techniques allowing them to complete works "all at once," in one sitting, in ways that echo painters



from centuries ago. They utilized a practiced familiarity with color theory and the interrelations of analogous and complementary colors for artistic effects. The Highwaymen artists visually understood the qualities of light and color that can be captured in ways to convey the illusion of depth and distance. And they took a page from old master artists by dabbing and scraping paint from the surface to reveal contrasting paint layers beneath, creating a varied and engaging visual texture at key points in a composition.

"There's kind of a myth about the artists we now call The Highwaymen," says J. Marshall Adams, Executive Director, "that they were naïve and because they didn't go to art school, they didn't know what they were doing. But the paintings tell a different story. They knew things, they learned things, they figured things out that are strikingly similar to the artists we're accustomed to seeing in the textbooks and throughout history. Making those connections can give us a new appreciation for the accomplishments of this unique art movement that began right here."

**The Highwaymen:** Art / History's closing reception is scheduled for Friday, February 18 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m, with brief remarks at 6:30 p.m. Members are admitted to receptions free; \$20 for not-yet members.

The Museum is planning to present its annual favorite *Highwaymen Celebration Weekend* on February 18 to 20, featuring free admission during regular hours. Visitors to the Museum can enjoy a range of special offerings outside and inside. The highlight of the weekend takes place on the Museum's Outdoor Mural Plaza, where people seeking to start or build their personal collections of Highwaymen paintings will be able to browse an impressive selection offered for purchase by professional dealers, specializing in the vintage works of these artists. This is an excellent opportunity to learn about the current

state of the art market and to explore owning an original work of art for your home or office.

Citizens of Tampa and visitors to the South Florida Fair, park your cars and your horses, for the Fort Pierce band, one of the very best on the Florida East Coast, is going to light on Tampa Monday morning, and punish musical instruments mornings, afternoons and nights in an effort to entertain the mighty throng at the Big Annual Show.

The Fort Pierce band compromises 25 pieces and gives year-round open air concerts in this city to large bodies of people. It has gone away from home on several occasions, upon invitation, and always brings down a fine bunch of applause. It will play at the St. Lucie county exhibit booth at the fairgrounds, in the business districts and the leading hotels of Tampa.

En route to Tampa the band will stop at the larger towns and give 15 to 20-minute concerts

## **Unkempt Condition Deplored Merchants of Fort Pierce to be Polled on Palm Trees**

What to do about the palm trees along downtown Fort Pierce streets was being pondered Friday by merchants following a discussion at their monthly meeting, when a committee was named to poll the merchants and ascertain whether they want the trees to remain or the city to remove them.

The committee, appointed by President E.C. Register, is made up of Merrill Haskell, L.O. Stephens and J.B. Harrison.

Action on the proposal came during an extended interrogation of City Manager C.E. Swank with reference to the unkempt condition of Fort Pierce streets.

Some spokesmen pointed out that the trees in their unkempt condition present a fire hazard, interfere with sign displays and are unsightly. Swank said the city doesn't have the personnel to keep them trimmed. Someone suggested that merchants could do their own trimming if they wanted to, except in some cases where the trees have grown tall.

The palms (Washingtonias) were planted years ago in a then citywide beautification program. Some of them have grown tall, others are still but a few feet high, and in some instances their fronds reach halfway across the sidewalk, without having been trimmed back for many months.

The prediction was made at the merchants' meeting that plenty of opposition will be found to removing the trees and the warning sounded that garden clubs had better be consulted before such a move is made.

Trecently had a chance to spend some time with Dennis Windowmaker (yes that is his name), who exhibits his paintings at the northwest corner of the *Saturday Morning Jazz Market*. Dennis is a talented artist with an amazing background. He showed me his latest original which he calls the *Rising Star*, an appropriate name for art exhibited at the *Jazz Market*. Stop by his tent on any Saturday and check it out.

Dennis appreciates what the *Fort Pierce Jazz and Blues Society* is doing for artists and vendors like him and is donating the original to the *Jazz Society* to be auctioned off on the Society's 25th anniversary in March. So, what is amazing about Dennis's art? Check out his website https://windowmaker.artstation.com/ and the fascinating various forms of art he creates.

Dennis is one of the new wave of artists who is not only good with pencil and brush but also good with stylus and computer tablet. Electronic art has been with us for a while, from Mickey Mouse, The Flintstones, to Star Trek and James Cameron's blockbuster Avatar. It's becoming difficult to tell what is real and what is computer generated. Windowmaker's mastery of programs like Zbrush and Lightwave can produce 3D visuals.

You can purchase his work in a digital form, download it to your computer and rotate it with your mouse in all axis. On his website, you will see works in photo realism, surreal, 3D and others but, when you step into Dennis's tent you will see mostly what he created on canvas with a brush, acrylic paint and occasional air brush.

The *Rising Star* he is donating is an original painting, an important distinction in the art world. I suppose you could be uncouth, snap a picture of any painting with an iPhone, print it on your Epson, frame it and hang it. There is also a recognized side of the art



world making museum quality reproductions and Dennis participates in it reproducing limited quantities of his art. The process is known as giclée and a large format Epson printer capable of doing this on canvas will cost several thousand dollars. Dennis owns one of those. These printers utilize upwards of twelve colors of ink and the ink is pigment-based, not dye-based like the one used in your office printer.

The concept of limited reproductions is to allow for more people to enjoy fine art. Obviously, there is only one original

Since the giclée process produces extremely good copies of the original, the copying runs are strictly controlled. Each copy must show the size of the run and the sequence of the painting in the run (ex. 16/500, 52/500, 250/500). It is not reproduced again. Should the artist or his work become sought after, the original would be the most valuable and the lowest numbered copies after that.

The printer Dennis owns utilizes canvas rolls 44 inches wide and 75 feet long. The canvas and archival inks used produce painting with a lifespan from 100 to 200 years, hence the description as "museum quality."

Dennis also works for corporate clients, creating logos, commercial advertising product design. His latest venture is 3D and jewelry sculpting. ❖



Manatee Center pollenator garden is an example of Florida-Friendly Landscaping

The Manatee Observation and Education Center (MOEC) was recognized by the University of Florida, Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF IFAS) Florida-Friendly Landscaping™ (FFL) Program. The pollenator garden is an accessible garden open to the public year-round at 480 N Indian River Drive, Fort Pierce, FL.

The MOEC Pollenator Garden is designed and maintained by dedicated MOEC volunteers. The garden evolved from grassy lawn to full pollenator garden in less than five years. Today, it holds 56 native and Florida-friendly plant species, and 16 butterfly species spotted, including the nearly-extinct Atala butterfly (Eumaeus atala). Pollenators are the key to our food production system, and pollenator gardens help to sustain their important populations. Visitors can experiene the quiet beauty of this garden at any time.

The FFL Program recognizes landscapes that use sustainable landscaping practices. Florida-Friendly landscapes minimize the use of potable water for irrigation, avoid runoff of excess fertilizers and pesticides from the landscape, and provide important habitats for wildlife. They can take any form, from more traditional to more natural. It's how the landscape is designed and maintained that ultimately determines if it's Florida-Friendly.

MOEC is a not-for-profit environmental learning center, located in downtown Fort Pierce, at the basin of Moore's Creek and the Indian River Lagoon. Now in its 26th year, the mission of MOEC is to promote understanding and responsible actions for the protection of the Treasure Coast's fragile ecosystem and its inhabitants. ## Sheepshead Heaven

If you want to catch fish all you have to do is get out on the water! This time of year, anglers are catching snapper, sheepshead, pompano, snook, trout, redfish, Spanish mackerel, and kingfish. Although sheepshead season is open year-round, now is the time they are abundant on the shallow reefs near shore. These tasty fish are known for their distinctive vertical black bars and sharp dorsal spines. Nothing is more fun than catching a sheep with every drop of bait.

Fishing for sheeps first thing in the morning as the sun comes up is a great time to catch the bite and put fish on deck. Try the shallow reefs along the beach in about 15-30 feet of water with light tackle, 30-pound fluorocarbon leader, a quarter-ounce jig, and live shrimp. If the ocean is a little too rough, look for these fish inside around structures like bridges, docks, seawalls, and jetties. Minimum size for a keeper sheepshead is 12 inches total length.

If you like smoked fish dip, get your fishing on for kingfish and mahi-mahi. Remember to look for weed lines and floating debris when targeting mahi. If weather permits, you can find the big mangroves and muttons in about 60-90 feet. This is the Treasure Coast and our treasure is the bounty of the sea! #### Bistec

Home is my place where I am safe from the outside world and a place to live freely. Visiting places like the Statue of Liberty remind us of the country we live in, a place where people are free and have rights. Seeing white and blue reminds me of my parent's birthplace, the Honduras, and remembering how they made their way here to the USA to have a chance at life and to live in the free world.

I felt most connected to my roots on December 24th, 2019. I visited New York City with family and we made amazing dishes like tamales, arroz con pollo and salsa verde. We were celebrating Christmas and it was an amazing experience.

The dish that I identify the most with is Bistec; in other words beef and onions. It may sound simple, but its flavor is one of a kind to me. The first time I made this dish was two years ago when my mother taught me how to make it.



### Recipe



11/2 lbs. beef sirloin thinly sliced

- 5 tbs. soy sauce
- 4 pieces calamansi or 1 piece of lemon
- ½ tsp. ground black pepper
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 3 pieces yellow onion sliced into rings
- 4 tbls. cooking oil
- l cup water

Stew beef and onions in soy sauce and calamansi with other ingredients until tender. This is good over rice.


