



Mayor's Message Florida's Affordable Housing Committees

n ecognizing that the lack of af-Nordable housing needs to be addressed at the local level, the Florida legislature is requiring local governments to form affordable housing advisory committees. The City of Fort Pierce formed its statutorily-required Affordable Housing Advisory Commit-

tee by ordinance 22-034 in November and appointed committee members for three-year terms by resolution 23-R11 on January 3.

The Committee includes one elected official. Commissioner Arnold Gaines volunteered to serve on this committee. He is also the city's representative on St. Lucie County Homeless Committee. Others appointed include: residential home builder: Phil Thomson; banking or mortgage industry, William Talley; advocate for low-income persons, Caleta Scott and Chad Ingram; real estate professional, Vernea Jones; essential services professional, Rafael Sanchez; and city residents, KeAndrea Davis and Leslie Olson.


The Florida Legislature passed FL Statute 420.9076, which requires any municipality receiving State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) Program funds. The purpose of this committee is to review policies, procedures, ordinances, land development regulations, and the adopted local government comprehensive plan, and to recommend specific actions or initiatives to encourage or facilitate affordable housing. The committee is required to submit an annual report to the Board of County Commissioners that includes recommendations on, and evaluates the implementation of, affordable housing incentives.

The City of Fort Pierce has already taken steps to ease the affordable housing need by approval of the Oaks at Moore's Creek, Phase II subdivision, where homes will be sold to property owners who meet Florida affordable housing requirements. The earlier Oaks at Moore's Creek, Phase I was a city initiative to provide affordable housing for essential workers, such as police, firefighters and educators. Additionally, the City of



Fort Pierce, in partnership with St. Lucie County, has approved two Blue Sky Communities affordable housing developments at Jenkins and Okeechobee Roads, and at 3000 Okeechobee Road. The city also used American Rescue Plan funds to augment its SHIP home buyer assistance program, one that requires eligibility and mandatory education in home ownership.

The Fort Pierce Housing Authority is a separate entity, with its own appointed board members. This is a federally administered HUD funded and regulated provider of low-income housing for eligible citizens. 🚸

"Dashboard Dreams: The Florida Highwaymen and the American *Road"* Exhibition at the A.E. Backus Museum


The next presentation of the 2022-23 season at the A.E. Back-**L** us Museum & Gallery continues the annual series of special exhibitions celebrating the unique art movement that traces its beginnings to our community. Dashboard Dreams: The Florida Highwaymen and the American Road considers the iconic imagery and inspirational story of the celebrated artists in the context of the American auto industry of the era. Dashboard Dreams is on view January 6 through February 26, at 500 N. Indian River Drive in Historic Downtown Fort Pierce.

The Florida Highwaymen are a loose collective of artists who learned landscape painting techniques but in the 1950s and 60s needed to develop a plan to reach the people that would buy their art. This movement started in Fort Pierce at a time in the racially segregated South when opportunities were limited for African Americans, yet the artists who later became known as The Highwaymen persevered and succeeded.

It was a practical solution for these artists to use cars to cross the color lines of the day. The automobile was the key to finding the audiences who would look beyond the artists' race and become enthralled by their luminous paintings of the Florida landscape. Meanwhile, the American auto industry was kindling aspirations for car ownership through alluring advertisements, depicting the promise of a fashionable lifestyle — and for the first time including African Americans as part of that visual narrative of the American dream.

"Cars and driving are obviously a central part of these artists' amazing story," says J. Marshall Adams, Executive Director of the Backus Museum. "It's been a clear understanding that automobiles gave African Americans in the South a degree of freedom from the race-based social practices of Jim Crow - you can see that here in the remarkable success for the Highwaymen artists at the time. And this was happening in the same moment that Detroit was making car ownership appealing to new audiences, advertising in *Ebony* and *Jet* magazines, building it into the status symbol for an expanding middle class. It all enabled and accelerated their artistic triumphs, one trunk-full of paintings at a time."

This exhibition presents these dreams realized, the freedom achieved, and the success the Florida Highwaymen negotiated on the road. Featuring more than 50 paintings by Harold Newton (1934-1994), Alfred Hair (1941-1970), R.A. "Roy" McLendon (b.1932), Willie Daniels (1950-2021) Mary Ann Carroll (1940-2019), Livingston Roberts (1942-2004), and more, this collection of sig-Continued on page 11 ...





FPUA Breaks Ground on the Long-Awaited Sewer Treatment Plant

Tort Pierce Utilities Authority Γ is excited to announce the longawaited groundbreaking of the new Mainland Sewer Treatment Plant, set to take place on Friday, February 3, 2023 at 2 p.m. at 4515 Energy Lane in Fort Pierce.

The groundbreaking and relocation represent a long-term, shared community commitment to growth and change in Fort Pierce and St. Lucie County. "After nearly 20 years, and multiple attempts to relocate the plant, local leaders, policymakers, and community members have come together to make this shared dream a possibility," said Bo Hutchinson, FPUA's Director of Water/Wastewater Systems.

The groundbreaking will double as

an informative and educational experience, where community members can get a feel for their new and long-awaited sewer treatment plant. Attendees are invited to take a virtual, immersive walk through the future facility and get a clear picture of what the end design will be. Attendees can also tour the physical site, learning all about the different buildings and functional components of the sewer treatment plant.

Speakers at the groundbreaking event include: Congressman Brian Mast, Ft. Pierce Mayor Linda Hudson, Representative Dana Trabulsy, Senator Erin Grall, Indian River Lagoon National Estuary Board Member and St. Lucie County Commissioner for District 2 Chris Dzadovsky, and members of the **FPUA** board and leadership.

FPUA has contracted joint venture GlobalTech-Haskell to carry out the design, which is nearly complete, and construction, which will begin this month and end in approximately December 2024. The sewer system's conveyance system will be redirected from eastward to westward flowing at the same time, with plans to operate both plants while the new plant is turned on in phases. The island plant is expected to be fully decommissioned in 2027.



The move will ensure that the vulnerable Indian River Lagoon is shielded from any potential catastrophe. The upgraded plant will be more energy-efficient and cost less to operate, saving our customers money. It will also reduce an average two million gallons per day of draw from Florida's aquifers by instead utilizing reuse water from the sewer plant for the cooling towers.

The Mainland Sewer Treatment Plant is a testament to FPUA's commitment to providing the highest quality services to our community. 

Prentice and Hair Trusdell are pleased to have master wood artist Jack Shelton exhibiting with them again this year. Shelton has been creating awardwinning wood art for over 30 years. He began making utilitarian pieces and then fell deeply in love with the grain, color and feel of





wood. In Jack's hands, wood is not an inanimate object - it comes alive. Shelton sees the beauty captured in the wood and releases it for all to see. His one-of-a-kind works of art have been shown all over the United States and are coveted by collectors worldwide.

You have probably seen and maybe even sat on Prentice's work. She is the mosaic artist responsible for the over 200 mosaic benches placed throughout St. Lucie County including at the Fort Pierce Jetty and Veterans Park. She is the resident artist for Heathcote Botanical Gardens and has created "Cobalt," a blue and white mosaic panda bear, a pair of mosaic lions and an old-fashioned hopscotch game in the Children's Garden. Brand new in 2022, "Gloria" the magnificent mosaic Gorilla in the







Rain Forest joined the collection. It is not a coincidence that one of the founders of the Garden was named Gloria Moore as Prentice chose to honor her memory and legacy with this installation. Prentice also works on a smaller scale and her mosaic landscapes, hibiscus and palm trees can be found hanging in most area homes. A couple of her lady bugs reside in France and one of her "Zora" portraits was exhibited in a show in Kent, England in 2022. Prentice was commissioned to create mosaic grave tributes to a number of the late Florida Highwaymen. In fact, that is how she first met Doretha Hair Trusdell, when she added a mosaic of his artwork to the grave marker for Hair Trusdell's late first husband, the Highwayman Alfred Hair.







February Fishing Fun!

Winter fishing brings plenty of opportunity to target several species and have some great fishing adventures. Local anglers are catching snapper, pompano, trout, snook, triggerfish, redfish, and sheepshead. While sheepshead can be caught yearround, now is the best time to try the shallow reefs near shore when they are in for feeding and breeding. Nothing beats the excitement of catching a fish with almost every drop of bait. These fish are easily recognized by their distinctive vertical black bars on their sides and sharp spines on their dorsal and anal fins. They provide a fun fight for anglers of all ages plus the promise of a very tasty fish dinner.

I recommend using live shrimp on light tackle with 30-pound fluorocarbon leader and a quarter-ounce jig. Find the shallow reefs along the beach in about 15 to 30 feet of water and plan to fish first thing in the morning as the sun comes up to be most productive. Some larger sheeps can get as big as 10-12 pounds but they generally run about 2-4 pounds. The minimum length for sheepshead is 12 inches although they can get double that size.

Snook season opens February 1st and there will be lots of anglers ready to catch that first keeper snook! Keepers are those snook that fall in the slot regulations of no less than 28 inches and no more than 32 inches which only makes targeting these elusive fish even more challenging.

Complete rules and regulations can be found at your local bait and tackle shops like Little Jim Bait & Tackle and **Debrooks Fishing Corner.**


