As I continued perusing the website, I found *free* on-line publications of the *Florida Heritage Trail*. Some of the publications are available to download and print and others are available to read on-line. As a prior educator I was thrilled to find this documented research, on my home state, and felt the need to share this wealth of information with you. Enjoy!

The Florida Department of State's Florida Heritage Trail series began in 1991 with the publication of the Florida Black Heritage Trail.

Since then, additional titles in the series include the World War II,

Native American, French, British and Florida Spanish Colonial Heritage Trails. The newest title, the *Florida Seminole Wars Heritage Trail*, was published in the summer of 2015. Designed to raise awareness of the state's cultural and historical resources, these educational and travel publications are popular resources for residents, students, historians and visitors to the state. Each volume identifies historical sites throughout Florida that are related to the volume topic and offers profiles and biographical sketches of significant individuals: dos.fl.gov/historical/preservation/heritage-trails.

Mayor's Message FPRA Mural Program Begins Second Round

The Fort Pierce Redevelopment Agency (FPRA) is seeking property owners to apply for murals on their buildings in the FPRA area. The target area for this round is U.S. Highway 1 to 10th Street, and Avenue B to Boston Avenue in the Peacock Arts District.

A call for artists occurs in November and December to apply and submit their ideas for murals. Once the artists have been

chosen, and their designs approved, work begins in January, with a target completion date in April.

The first round of murals was celebrated September 25 at Orange Avenue and 7th Street, with all three artists in attendance. Take a walk west of U.S. 1 on Orange Avenue to see Zoey Allysa's murals at 500 Orange (the old Post Office), Niko Holderbaum's art at 605 Orange (the old Silver Palace Pharmacy) and Samara Ash's mural at 616 Atlantic. Finally, Zoey Allyssa has a second mural at 700 Orange Avenue.






Save the Date: The St. Lucie County Christmas Boat Parade December 9 at 6 p.m.

U.S. Department of Energy Selects FPUA for \$5.8M Federal Funding FPUA will increase power grid resiliency across the Fort Pierce service area

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) selected Fort Pierce Utilities Authority to receive \$5,828,993 to enhance and modernize the Fort Pierce electric grid. The funds will advance FPUA's broader initiative to storm-harden and modernize the electric grid ensuring grid reliability and quality of service for our customers.

"Today's announcement represents the largest-ever direct investment in critical grid infrastructure, supporting projects that will harden systems, improve energy reliability and affordability," said U.S Secretary of Energy Jennifer M. Granholm. "Extreme weather events fueled by climate change will continue to strain the nation's aging transmission systems, but President Biden's Investing in America agenda will ensure America's power grid can provide reliable, affordable power."

"FPUA is incredibly proud to bring this support and funding to our community," said Javier Cisneros, FPUA Director of Utilities. "These projects empower FPUA to maintain reliable electric service while reducing impacts on the grid caused by unexpected outages, extreme weather, and natural disasters. This project also represents tremendous effort by our electric and grant writing teams to build more resilient and sustainable infrastructure for Fort Pierce with support from grant funding."

The funds are part of the *Grid Resilience and Innovation Partnerships* (GRIP) *Program*, which seeks to enhance grid flexibility and improve the resilience of the power system against growing threats of extreme weather and climate change. Funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and administered by DOE's Grid Deployment Office, the GRIP program leverages federal and private investments to ensure that communities across the nation have a reliable grid that's prepared for extreme weather while also delivering affordable, clean energy and creating robust local opportunities for economic investment and jobs.

Key features of FPUA's grant funded project include: Upgrade two critical substation transformers to accommodate growing electric demand; replace four distribution transformers for modernization; upgrade a major substation to ring bus configuration for modernization and automation; and install 400 mounted reclosers to reduce outage frequency and duration.

FPUA is grateful to the U.S. Department of Energy for this grant funded project. This is major support toward **FPUA's** infrastructure initiatives and is just one of many current projects led by **FPUA** including: relocating the sewer treatment plant off the Indian River Lagoon; lining sewer pipes with PVC to protect against inflow and outflow from cracks in aging clay pipes; installing several more acres of seagrass grant funding from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection Resilient Florida program; and more.

FPUA and MOEC Bring Seagrass Restoration to the Indian River Lagoon

ovember is here, and that means it's *Manatee Awareness Month!* Did you know seagrass is the primary food source for manatees and many other marine organisms? Seagrass meadows are among the most productive habitats in the world, not only providing food and shelter for marine animals but also assisting in improving the water quality by removing harmful pollutants like excess Nitrogen.

Fort Pierce Utilities Authority (FPUA) recognizes the importance of clean waterways and healthy habitats in our community and has been supporting the Manatee Observation and Education Center (MOEC) since 1996. Together, MOEC and FPUA have been implementing seagrass restoration activities within the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) for several years, working closely with Florida seagrass restoration experts at the widely recognized Sea & Shoreline, LLC.

During the 2021 12 Days of Christmas Fundraising Campaign, MOEC and MOEC's sister nonprofit, the Treasure Coast Manatee Foundation (TCMF), mobilized and raised over \$58,000 to restore one acre of seagrass in Moore's Creek by the Manatee Center. This pioneer project was so successful that in early 2022, MOEC submitted a proposal to the Indian River Lagoon National Estuary Program (IRLNEP) and was awarded almost \$40,000 toward additional seagrass restoration activities including restoration research next to the Fort Pierce Yacht Club.

These first two seagrass restoration activities were broken up into two phases. Phase 1 included the installation of more than



5,000 seagrass shoots starting at **MOEC**, the mouth of Moore's Creek, and continuing upstream. Phase 2 is located directly on the western coast of the IRL, adjacent to the **Fort Pierce Yacht Club**, and installed over 2,000 seagrass shoots. Throughout the project, **MOEC** volunteers donated over 900 hours as Roving Naturalists, counting manatee sightings in Moore's Creek and teaching passersby all about the seagrass restoration initiatives taking place in Downtown Fort Pierce.

The results of this project are estimated to remove as much as 220 pounds of nitrogen per planted acre over a five-year *Continued on page 14*...

growth period, and an additional 42 pounds per year in the following years. To date, seagrass coverage has expanded from less than 5% coverage to roughly 85% coverage in several areas.

Fort Pierce is not the only community committed to improving our waterways and we proudly share our projects and results with neighbors. When news of **FPUA's** seagrass restoration initiative broke, Florida House Representatives Tobin "Toby" Overdorf (District 85) and the District Aide for Kaylee Tuck (District 83) visited to tour the project. Research from this initial, and future, restoration activities will assist in identifying the best species blends of seagrass and methodology to ensure success in improving the water quality in the lagoon.

FPUA continues to include seagrass restoration activities in our grant proposals related to relocating the Water Reclama-

tion Facility (WRF) off the IRL. Earlier this year, **FPUA** was awarded \$15 million dollars from the *Florida Department of Environmental Protection Resilient Florida* program toward the WRF Relocation, which included the installation of 2.23 acres of seagrass along the coast adjacent to the current WRF site.

This year, **FPUA** submitted an additional proposal to the *Resilient Florida Program*, which included the installation of an additional 2.47 acres of seagrass near the current WRF site. If awarded, **FPUA** will install a combined total of 6.2 acres of seagrass since 2022.

FPUA is grateful for the support of the many organizations and community members that make this work possible. Thank you. ❖

FPRA Launches the Commercial Façade Grant

The Fort Pierce Redevelopment Agency (FPRA) is excited to announce the launch of the Commercial Façade Grant Program. This program will be available for application during three different periods throughout the fiscal year. The first application period will be open from Tuesday, October 17, 2023, until Friday, November 17, 2023.

This grant program offers financial assistance in the form of a reimbursable grant, matching 50% of eligible expenses, up to a maximum of \$25,000. To be eligible for this grant, the property in question must be located within the FPRA District and must be commercially zoned.

The primary goal of the *Commercial Façade Grant Program* is to contribute to the revitalization of the commercial corridors within the FPRA district. It aims to achieve this by encouraging private investment in improvements that enhance the appearance of buildings and properties, thus eliminating blight and non-

conforming design standards. The ultimate aim of this program is to stimulate redevelopment in the FPRA, leading to improved visual aesthetics, increased property values, higher tenant occupancy, economic development, and job creation.

It's important to note that this reimbursable grant program will also be available for application in March and June of 2024.

"Cooler" Weather Gardening in South Florida

redictively, the high temperatures of our Florida summer started to come back down last month. We had a couple fronts that brought the heat down to a more comfortable and tolerant level. And, once again, our mornings and evenings are seeing some cooler breezes. The plants have noticed these changes as well. Some established plants that refused to set fruit in hotter temperatures like peppers and tomatoes are flowering again. The Barbados Cherry tree I planted earlier in the spring has awoken from its summer slumber and started producing its delicious cherries. The Seminole Pumpkin plant started earlier this year now has new growth daily. It is interesting watching the changes in the different types of plants as the seasons progress.



south than it has been all summer. It is amazing the differences you notice when you focus on providing the best conditions for your plants to survive (while also realizing you cannot control mother nature). It is also a great way to take a step out of the craziness of the world. I work from home so during my brain breaks I walk around the yard and

check on each of my many plants. This routine is very relaxing and resets me mentally. I highly recommend it!

It is still planting season for cooler temperature vegetables. I planted some lettuces and cabbages last month. I plan on

planting a couple of different varieties of cauliflower, broccoli, carrots, and onions at the beginning of November; and will also be transplanting the seedlings I started in late September and October into the garden beds and along the trellis'. Speaking of the trellis, out of the 17 beans starts I had growing last month, only 5 remain. I suspect the wild bunnies but apparently it could also be birds. I ordered some chicken wire to make cages around each remaining bean plants and so far, this has worked. They are all still thriving as of this writing.

Get outside this month and enjoy the cooler temperatures! Happy gardening!






The Importance of Community



Fantastic Fall Fishing

by Captain Bo Samuel

Cooler weather and cooler waters means November is moving in and more fish are coming in, too. This time of year provides amazing opportunities to catch your own fish dinner so watch for those good weather windows around expected cold fronts and enjoy our great fall fishing.

Bottom fishing continues to be the best strategy with nice mangroves and big muttons chewing on the 60–90 foot reef. Frozen bait will work but live bait is best and since they are aggressive feeders, I recom-

mend using a chum bag to get them stirred up. Whichever bait you use, live or cut-up frozen, keep your bait on the bottom with enough weight and be ready for some action. Targeting snapper will give you a very good chance at a granddaddy grouper or two. Grouper season is open until the end of December, except for gag. FWC just issued a new executive order that closed recreational harvest of gag grouper in Atlantic state waters, as well as federal waters, on October 23rd. We're told the gag population is experiencing overfishing and this is part of the new rebuilding plan.



Inshore action has been great for snook and redfish. Live mullet or pilchards will give the best chance for hooking a snook. Keep the drag tight and be ready to set back on the rod when that snook hits. If you're lucky enough to land one in the slot, between 28 inches and 32 inches, you'll have a great fish story and a great fish dinner!

3 Chopped Cloves of Garlic

2 tsp. Ground Cumin

1-1/2 tbsp. Chili Powder

1 tsp. Salt

1 tsp. Pepper

½ tsp. Cinnamon

2 cans of Fire Roasted Tomatoes (Not drained / 15 oz. can)

1 can of Kidney Beans (Not drained / 15 oz. can)

1 can of Black Beans (Drained / 15 oz. can)

1 can of Pumpkin Puree (15 oz.)


2-1/2 cups of Chicken Broth

Instructions

Heat up oil, add sausage and cook. Once sausage is cooked, drain any excess oil. Then cook onion and bell pepper





